What the 2026 centennial marks

The anniversary belongs to the U.S. Route 17 designation in the U.S. Numbered Highway System, not to every present-day mile, bridge, bypass, or endpoint.

- [] November 11, 1926 is the final-approval date used by the Route17RoadTrip centennial guide.
- [] The original broad U.S. 17 corridor ran from Jacksonville, Florida, to Winchester, Virginia.
- [] Treat the history at corridor level unless the live guide supports a more precise local alignment claim.

Accuracy posture

Do not assume every modern U.S. 17 segment has carried the number unchanged since 1926.

HERITAGE

How the route grew south

Punta Gorda is the modern southern beginning of Route17RoadTrip, but it was not the original 1926 southern endpoint.

- [] U.S. 17 later extended south from Jacksonville through central Florida to Punta Gorda.
- [] The current Route17RoadTrip source keeps the exact extension year unresolved and uses the supported early-1930s timeframe.
- [] Jacksonville therefore has a different historical endpoint role from Punta Gorda, even though Punta Gorda is the modern southern start used by this guide.

Jacksonville Original broad southern-endpoint story.	Punta Gorda Modern southern start after the early-1930s extension.	Winchester Original broad northern-endpoint story and modern finish.

HERITAGE

Original corridor and modern road

Use route history to deepen the drive without turning uncertain alignment details into false certainty.

1926 designation	U.S. 17 is part of the original numbered-highway system approved in 1926.
Original corridor	Broad Jacksonville-to-Winchester story.
Later Florida growth	Southward extension through central Florida to Punta Gorda in the early 1930s.
Modern corridor	Five-state Route17RoadTrip planning spine from Punta Gorda to Winchester.
Caution	Extensions, local changes, realignments, bypasses, bridges, and modern planning needs all belong to the route story.
